Tibet - High Plateau Ride

The Riding

Pace will be dictated by the terrain.

At the beginning of the ride it will be at a walk. As the ride progresses there will be long trots and canters. The horses are local Tibetan mountain horses: small (12.3hh – 14.3hh), sturdy and surefooted. These are working horses, used on the open grassland for herding. There is a rider weight limit of 85kgs.

Experience the untouched nomadic culture of eastern Tibet and visit some of the remote Buddhist monasteries on this authentic wilderness experience. Equipment is carried by pack horses or yaks and during the ride there is no vehicle support.

Tibet became part of China in the late 1950s and the route takes you through the upland grasslands of what is now Sichuan Province. The rolling hills of the high plateau are framed by the snow capped peaks of the Min Shan and Anye Machin mountains.

The ride is timed to coincide with local religious festivals which take place during the summer months.
